Our Location

Internships

More than 80 percent of our students participate in internships or practicums to gain real-world experience and explore career interests. With support from our Career Center, these students complete two or three internships on average.

Mentored Undergraduate Student Experience (MUSE)

Nearly 100 undergraduates work closely with about 50 faculty members to conduct research or collaborate on creative projects each year. They develop new technologies, create innovative works, and publish scientific findings in peer-reviewed journals, all under the wings of faculty at the leading edge of their fields.

Supporting TCNJ's International Students

From day one, international students have access to the programs and people that will enrich their undergraduate experience.

The Center for Global Engagement *iss.pages.tcnj.edu/*

This center provides support to international students at TCNJ and coordinates international experiences for students - including study abroad, international internships, academic research projects, and faculty-led travel programs. In recent years, we've seen a substantial increase in the number of exchanges, the number of international students at TCNJ, and the number of collaborations between our faculty and scholars around the World. Our trained personnel help students navigate immigration paperwork, prepare for orientation and housing assignments, and choose the right courses to meet their academic goals. The Center for Global Engagement also hosts a slate of activities, including culture nights and workshops on communication and leadership.



Institute for English as a Second Language and American Studies (ESLAS) esl.pages.tcnj.edu

This immersion program gives nonnative speakers of English the opportunity to *earn college credits* while developing their knowledge of American English and culture. Mixing small-group work, lectures, and cultural programs, this experience prepares students to succeed at TCNJ or other American institutions of higher education. In addition to film showings and social gatherings, participating students enjoy practicing the skills they need to succeed as an undergraduate in the U.S. We teach the rules of English grammar and syntax, and we develop students' note-taking skills, discussion skills, presentation and writing skills, listening skills, and ability to identify and interpret culturally appropriate behaviors.

Admissions Requirements

- Standardized Test Results (SAT or ACT test scores preferred)
- TOEFL or IELTS scores required if English is not your native language*
- Original or certified copy of all transcripts; foreign transcripts may need to be translated and/or evaluated by an approved agency
- Application Fee
- International Student Admissions Booklet

*If minimum requirements are not met, applicants may qualify for <u>Conditional</u> <u>Admission</u> to the institution if eligible for the College's ESLAS Institute (see above).

Application Deadlines

First-Year Students

- Early Decision—November 15
- Fall Admission—February 15
- Spring Admission—November 1
- Seven-year Medical and Optometry Program—December 1**

**Students in this program must obtain U.S. citizenship or permanent resident status by the time they enter the medical school.
