Community

Upon arrival, students will be provided free transportation to our International Welcome Orientation. At orientation, new students and families will have the opportunity to meet the International Recruitment team and will begin moving into Campus Housing. In addition to other on-campus housing options, students will have the option to live in the International House, or I-House. The I-House is a living-learning community on campus, housing students who share an interest in learning about other cultures and promoting educational campus events.

International students will then partake in our Welcome Week orientation program. Welcome Week offers a variety of events, information sessions, and opportunities to meet your peers and members of the community!

International Student Services

Part of the Center for Global Engagement, this resource provides support to international students, including assistance with visas, housing, travel, healthcare, and more.

Original or certified copy of all transcripts; foreign transcripts may need to be evaluated and/or approved by an approved agency
- Application Fee

Application Deadlines

First-Year Students

- Early Decision I—November 1
- Early Decision II—January 1
- Fall Admission—February 1
- Spring Admission—November 1
- Seven-year Medical and Optometry Program—November 1**

***Students in this program must obtain U.S. citizenship or permanent resident status by the time they enter the medical school.*

Transfers

- Fall Admission—February 1
- Spring Admission—November 1
